Focusing on Others

Discipleship groups purpose: Each member being transformed into the image of the Son.

Key Truth: Genuinely seeking the interests of others, ahead of one's own.

Read:

Last weeks main point was focusing on the Creator and not on the creation. Only when we live like this are we able to genuinely put others interests and needs ahead of our own. 1 John 3:16 teaches us that if we know love, God, we ought to lay our lives down for our brethren.

Jesus laid His life down for us because of His love for us (John 3:16) and we are to follow the example we are given by the Son, as sons (1 John 3:16). We are called to follow in Jesus's™ footsteps and model this giving of our lives for our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Philippians 2:19-22

¹⁹ But I hope in the Lord Jesus to send Timothy to you shortly, so that I also may be encouraged when I learn of your condition. ²⁰ For I have no one else of kindred spirit who will genuinely be concerned for your welfare. ²¹ For they all seek after their own interests, not those of Christ Jesus. ²² But you know of his proven worth, that he served with me in the furtherance of the gospel like a child serving his father.
