


PROPHECY:

WHEN HE COMES
KNOCKING ON YOUR DOOR



Purpose of the value of Discipleship being lived out: being made into the image of the Son

Key Theme: Prophecy: When He comes knocking.

Key Truth: Do not despise prophetic utterances.

Key scriptures: *1 Thessalonians 5:20, Revelation 3:20*

We have to come to understand that prophetic utterances are way more than a Prophet giving us a word from God, about what He sees us doing in the future or some information about our situation or circumstance.

Prophetic utterances are utterances that come from the eternal realm. The realm of the spirit. The scriptures are prophetic utterances because they all come from the realm of the spirit. The booklet we have put together with a number of key instructions and statements for us as a family are prophetic utterances of what the Father is saying and expecting. The messages we speak week in week out are prophetic utterances.

To despise prophetic utterances is to disregard what the Spirit is saying to you as the church and as individuals. It is to give no or little attention to what is for you and one does this to their own detriment.

The gospel is one big prophetic utterance of what the Father's will is for His church. God has spoken to man and man has captured the heart beat and the mission of the Father for His church.

Jesus is found knocking on the outside of the door of the Laodicean church. The door represents the heart. He wants us to let Him in so we can dine with Him and He can reveal within us all, His prophetic utterances, in other words His promises for us as His people.

To despise prophetic utterances is to quench and grieve the Holy Spirit. When we do this the Spirit can no longer fulfil His order of teaching us and leading us into the fullness of truth. Once again we do this to our own downfall.

We are called to be a prophetic people. We are called to hear, receive and understand the prophetic utterances of Heaven, which are for us and our transformation. Let's be a people who earnestly seek what we hear and understand what we hear, so we live the life we are called for.

Questions:

- Q. Why is despising prophetic utterances so detrimental to us?
- Q. The entire scriptures and messages preached are prophetic utterances. How important are the scriptures and messages to you?
- Q. What transformation starts to occur within us through hearing and understanding God's prophetic utterances?
- Q. How has this resource helped you to gain a greater understanding of the importance of receiving what the Father is saying?

Action point: From going through this resource what do you sense the Holy Spirit is saying you may need to action or look into?
